Ministry Highlight - Food Pantry Update

Most of you know that Cloverdale has a very robust food pantry. Do you know how robust it is? I have learned a lot more about it from Linda Easley. It is impressive! It is exciting!

What a ministry to the local community...

This is a ministry that has a VERY BIG need! Currently, there are two volunteers that operate the food pantry. We need MORE VOLUNTEERS! Linda Easley and Lorraine Murray have made this their ministry wheelhouse. Linda told me that if they had only six more volunteers, they could be open every Sabbath. (six more volunteers could amount to a commitment of one weekend per month)

Currently they are open two Sabbaths out of the month from 2:00 - 4:30 PM.


Food is provided by the Idaho Food Bank. A solid commitment is super important to this ministry, as the volunteers must go down to the Idaho Food Bank to pick up the food by 3:00 PM on Friday. The food is transported back to Cloverdale where the pantry shares space with the thrift store. The volunteers may have to create some space, by mildly rearranging the thrift store to accommodate the food display.

I am so impressed with the job that Linda & Lorraine are doing! Since March of 2021, over 7200 pounds of food has been distributed to over 80 families. I can say with confidence that this number has significantly risen to date.

Just think how Cloverdale could make an impact on hunger, within the Treasure Valley, if the food pantry were open every Sabbath!

Let's make it happen!

Today, we are seeing many people stumble around...they have no clear vision. The wisest man who ever lived wrote the following, "Where there is no vision, the people perish". Proverbs 29:18 (KJV)

Many are perishing today because there is a mask over their eyes. Either they do not want to see the truth, or some have been pressured into following another blind person. This will only end up in pain and suffering.
